Professional Ethics for Structural Engineers

What is professional ethics? How does it differ from ordinary ethics and morality? What should a structural engineer do when professional ethics and ordinary ethics conflict?

o any of these questions matter for the practicing structural engineer? This presentation will explore these and related questions. First, it will introduce the concepts of professional and ordinary ethics and explain the possible tension between them, using examples from structural engineering and other fields. Next, the presentation will explore practical questions of professional ethics in context, including competence, communications with clients and nonclients, conflicts of interest and reporting misconduct. Finally, it will examine the relationship between professional ethics, competitive market forces and legal liability.


