QBS Colorado

Qualifications Based Selection Colorado has a goal to persuade public and private agencies to utilize QBS in selecting design consultants. SEAC became a member in 2007, joining ACEC, PC, AIA, and CAGE to help promote QBS in Colorado.

QBS offers to public and private agencies guidance in:

- Procuring architectural/engineering services
- · Establishing evaluation criteria
- Soliciting qualifications statements
- Developing the short list
- Interviewing
- Defining the project
- Post selection process

Strategies include:

- Conducting educational programs promoting the merits of QBS
- Recognizing agencies/groups that exemplify QBS best practices
- Contact groups/agencies that are not using QBS to discuss QBS methods
- Conduct brown-bag seminars with organizations, agencies, and firms in A/E community
- Legislative action
- QBS Colorado is an organization that advocates the selection of design professionals based on qualification.

Why is this important to SEAC members? As professionals charged with public safety our designs cannot be compromised. We should be looking for best solutions for our clients rather than finding ways of shortcutting the design because we were selected based upon a low fee. Fair pricing of consultants can result in better service and a more economical solution to the owner. Best value in lieu of lowest fee.

What can we, as SEAC members do? First, if we are selecting sub consultants we should be using

QBS in our selection process. Second we need to find a way change the fee proposal practice used by many of our clients when selecting consultants. To facilitate this process we need to eliminate fee proposals and go to selection by qualifications and fee negotiations.

One last thought, would the SEAC member firms be willing to pledge not to 'bid' their services? The next time you receive a request for a fee, and you have not yet been selected for the project, submit the proposal, but omit the fee. Indicate a fee will be negotiated once you have been selected. I believe this process will be beneficial to our industry as well as to our clients.
