
# NOVEMBER ANNUAL DINNER

## **SEPTEMBER BREAKFAST MEETING**

If you missed the September breakfast meeting you missed an excellent presentation on Non-destructive Evaluation of Masonry. **David B. Woodham, P.E.**, Vice-president of Atkinson-Noland & Associates, gave an overview of the non-destructive techniques that can be used to evaluate masonry structures. He described the use of surface hardness testing, infrared thermography, ultrasonic and mechanical pulse velocity measurements, surface penetrating radar, x-ray and in situ masonry tests.



**Mayor Hickenlooper** spoke to the attendees and recognized the contribution structural engineers make to the community. He spoke about the shortage of engineers in the United States and the need to increase the number of engineers to be able to compete with other countries in today's global market.
